Dear parents/carers,

We would like to once again thank all parents that are uploading entries onto their tapestry accounts. It is so lovely to see what you and your families do together outside of nursery. It provides a great conversation start for the children during circle times and gives us a lot of really valuable information. If you have been anywhere or done anything over October, please feel free to upload onto your tapestry accounts for us to see.

In the previous newsletter it was highlighted that there is no link between playing outside in the fresh air and picking up viruses, coughs and colds. We are still experiencing a number of parents informing us that they do not want their children playing outside or informing us that their child is sick from playing outside. Playing outside boosts a child's immune system and does not mean they will contract illnesses as the air is cleaner outside where germs are not compact in an inside space. Please read last month's newsletter for more information and the research that was provided.

As winter is fast approaching can all parents please ensure their child has a warm coat, hats, scarves and gloves with them so that they can be as warm as possible when playing outside.

A few weeks ago parents were all emailed some questionnaires. If you are yet to complete this, we kindly ask that you do so as your responses are vital to us improving our service and ensuring that we offer you the best possible care that we can based on your suggestions.

Once again we would like to remind parents that plastic bags and drawstring bags should not be entering the setting. Going forward if these are the bags that are handed to us at the door, the items will be removed and the bag given back to you. We aim to ensure that the nursery is the safest environment possible and eliminating these bags will help us do so.

Care diaries on Tapestry have allowed us to take a step in the right direction in becoming more environmentally friendly. We are thrilled with the new system and would like to remind parents that checking your child's care diary is very important as this is also where staff will now ask you for items such as nappies, wipes and spare clothes.

We had so many fun events in October. A huge well done to everyone who got involved in the dressing up days and to those who brought in items from home that they needed for activities at nursery, your participation means the world! We hope that November is just as exciting as October was.
